

CNNB Registration Requirements

For Internationally Educated Nurses

National Nursing Assessment Service (NNAS) Application
Candidates must submit documents and credentials to the National Nursing Assessment Service (NNAS) for verification and assessment.

CNNB Application & Pay Fees
Once candidates have received their NNAS Advisory Report, they must apply to CNNB and pay the applicable fees.

Language Proficiency
Submit evidence of language proficiency in either English or French.

Currency of Practice in Last Five Years
Candidates must provide evidence of the number of hours practiced as a Registered Nurse (RN), in the last five (5) years, by submitting a Currency of Practice Affidavit, or by having completed your nursing education program in the last 5 years.

Competency Assessment & Courses (Optional)
Complete the Inspire Global Assessments competency assessment and any courses identified to bridge competency gaps.

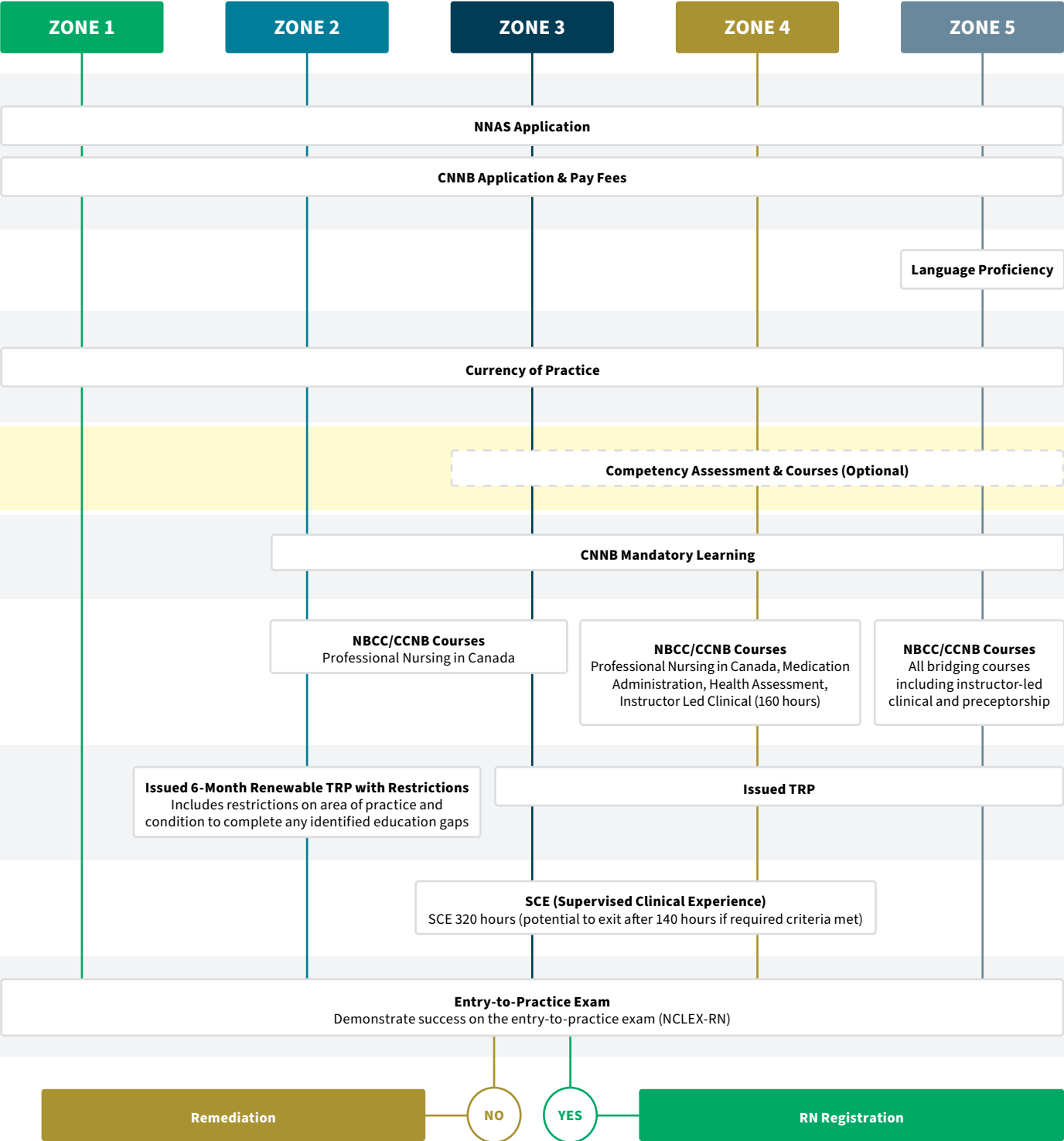
CNNB Mandatory Learning
Zones 2,3,4 and 5 are required to complete mandatory learning activities made up of learning modules and readings of standards and guidelines defined by CNNB.

NBCC/CCNB Mandatory Learning
Candidates must complete any necessary education requirements (online and/or in-person) at New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) or Collège Communautaire du Nouveau-Brunswick (CCNB).

Temporary Registration Permit (TRP)
A 6-month renewable TRP will be issued to candidates and they must complete any additional education requirements during this time.

Supervised Clinical Experience
While holding a 6-month renewable TRP.

Entry-to-Practice Exam
Candidates must demonstrate success on the entry-to-practice exam (NCLEX-RN).
