The NANB regulates the largest group of health professionals (registered nurses and nurse practitioners) representing over 11,189 nurses (NANB, 2024).

With the growing number of 24,717+ New Brunswick citizens on the Patient Connect Registry (CBC, 2023) waiting for a health provider, NANB believes NPs are critical to decreasing wait lists. NANB considers access to care as the most urgent priority for the next government.

Enhanced Roles of the RN & NP



Government support for a revised *Nurses Act*, allowing the nursing regulator to be innovative and able to provide timely and proactive responses to nursing practice and health system changes.



Implement RN prescribing improving community-based care.

Primary Health Care



Further expand collaborative care clinics/patient 'homes' that optimize all scopes of practice, and create NP-led interprofessional clinics.



Support additional NP positions to create NP-led interdisciplinary clinics as part of an improving Primary Health Care access in New Brunswick that are external to the RHAs.



Optimize access to care through increased use of telenursing/virtual care. Further leverage utilization of technology for consultations and referrals.

Support for the electronic health record to streamline communication and continuum of care.

Support for changes to the *Nurse Act* allowing for:

- the nursing regulator to be agile and able to provide timely and proactive responses to nursing practice and health system changes, and
- the support of RN prescribing, improving community based care.
